


## DOLLY'S WORLD OF FEELINGS



Directions: Help Dolly find the correct path through her feelings maze.






# DOLLY DOT-to-DOT




Directions: Trace and color Dolly. Then, draw a picture of her brother, Henry.





#### MY FEELINGS MOVIE






Example: Tape each scene to make a continuous movie strip.

### MY FEELINGS MOVIE



Directions: Make the movie camera first. Cut along the dotted lines. Cut both the front and back of the camera. Fold the tabs along the solid lines in the front. Glue the folded tabs to the back part of the camera. Once you create your scenes, slide them through the camera as shown below.
